SENIOR CLASS HISTORY



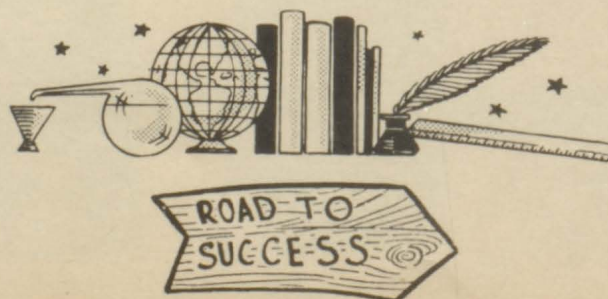
