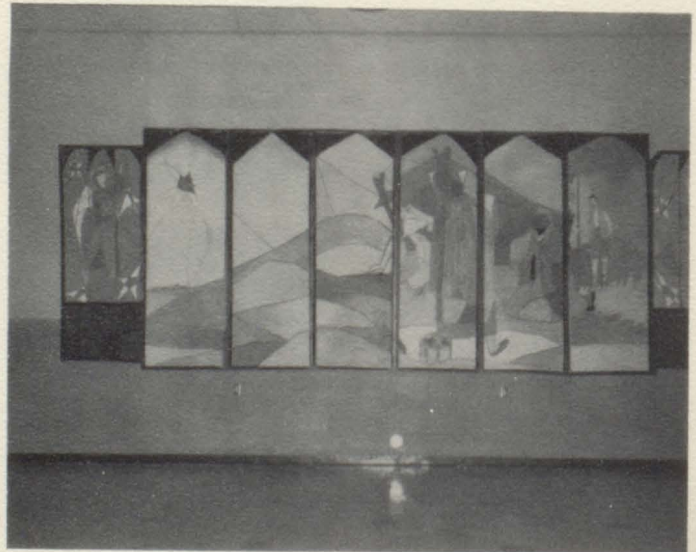
Senior Class History

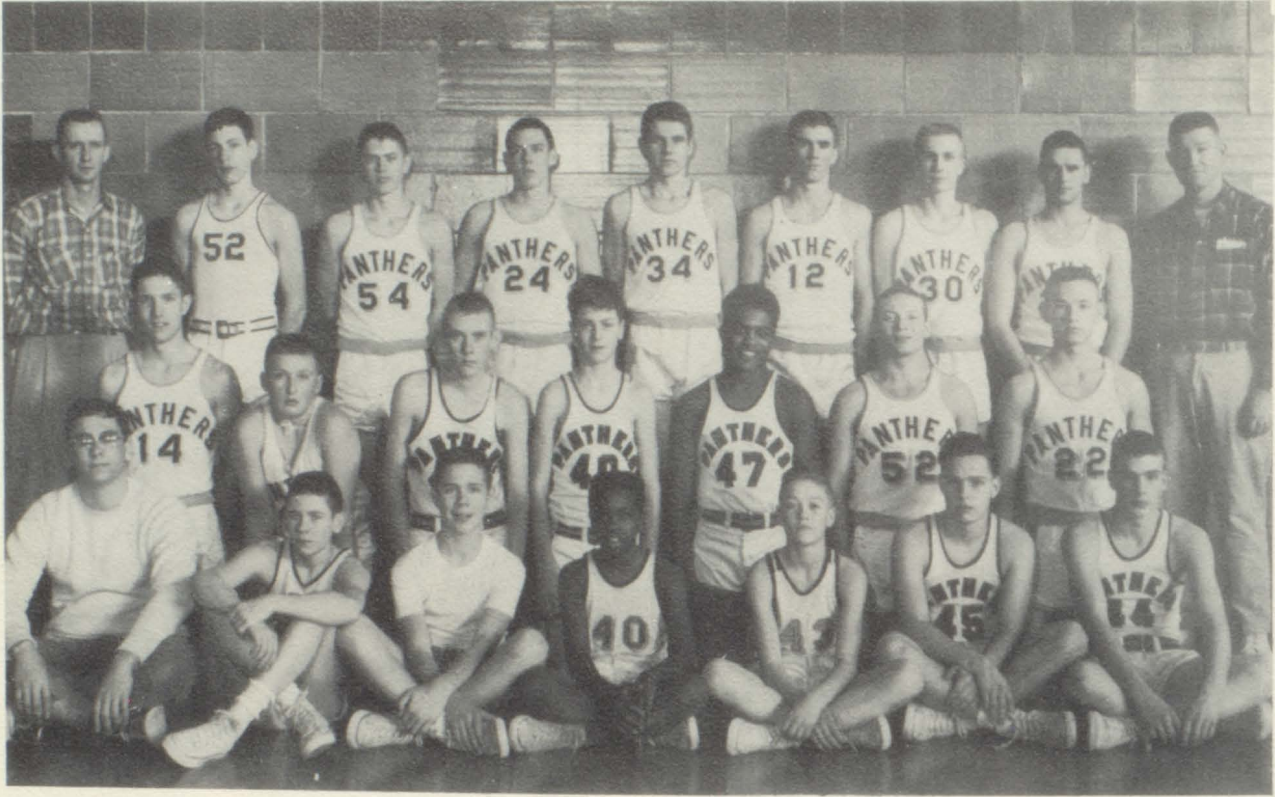

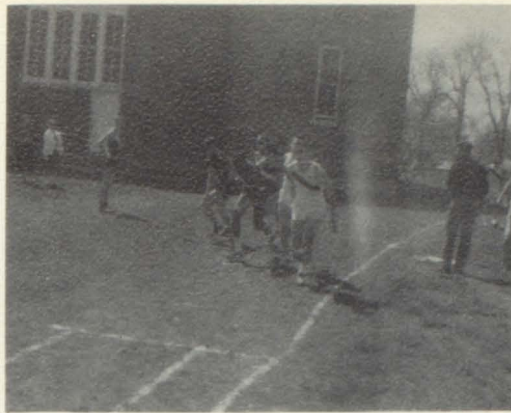

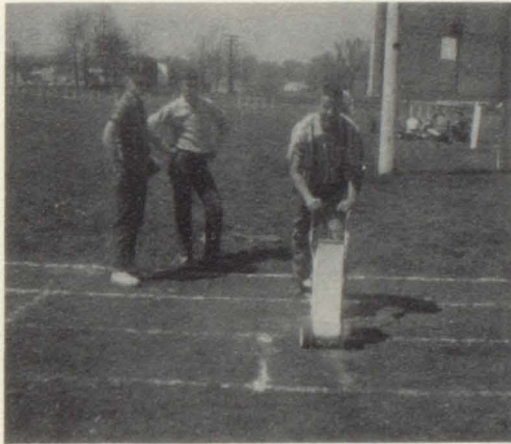
