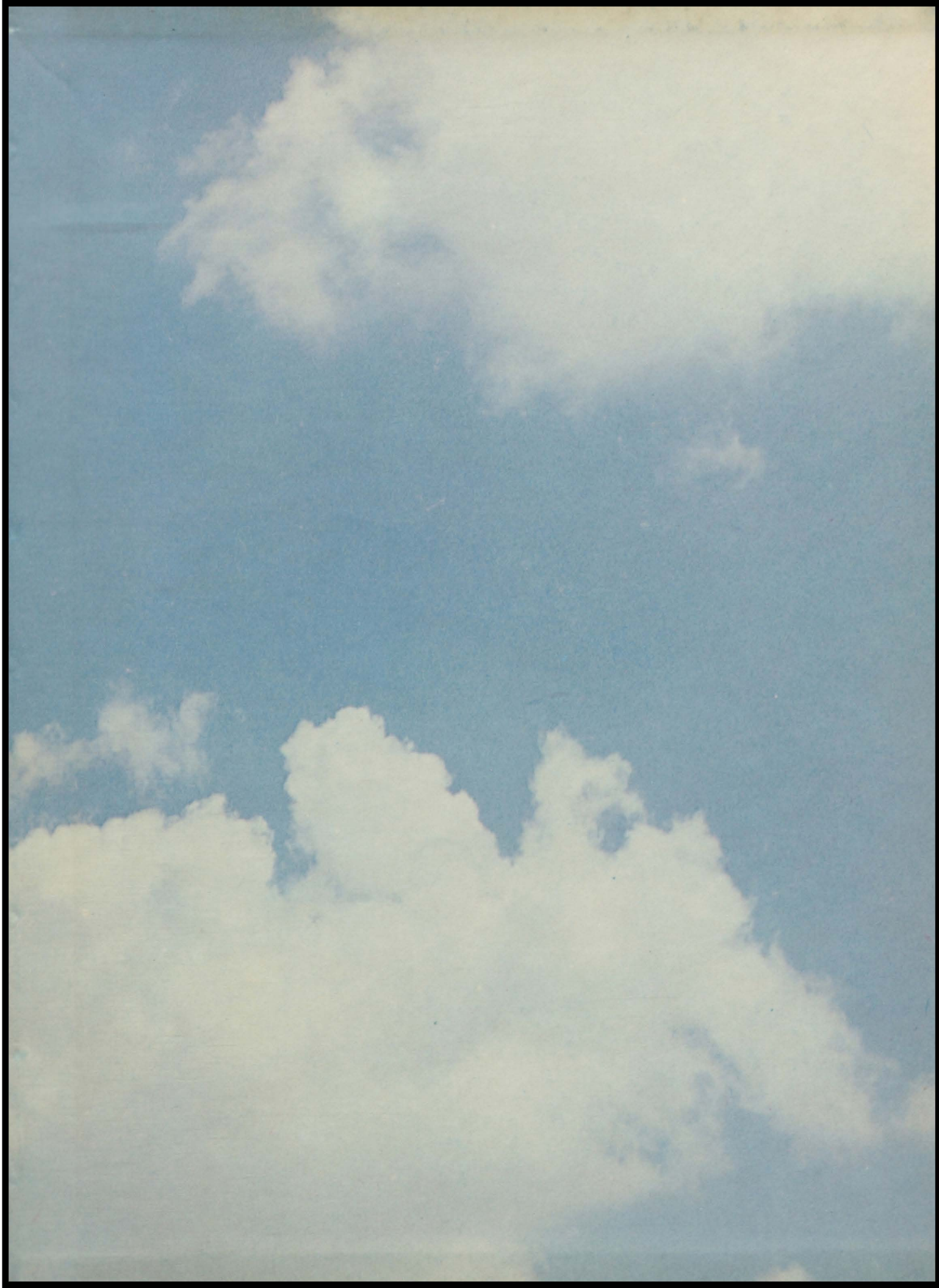

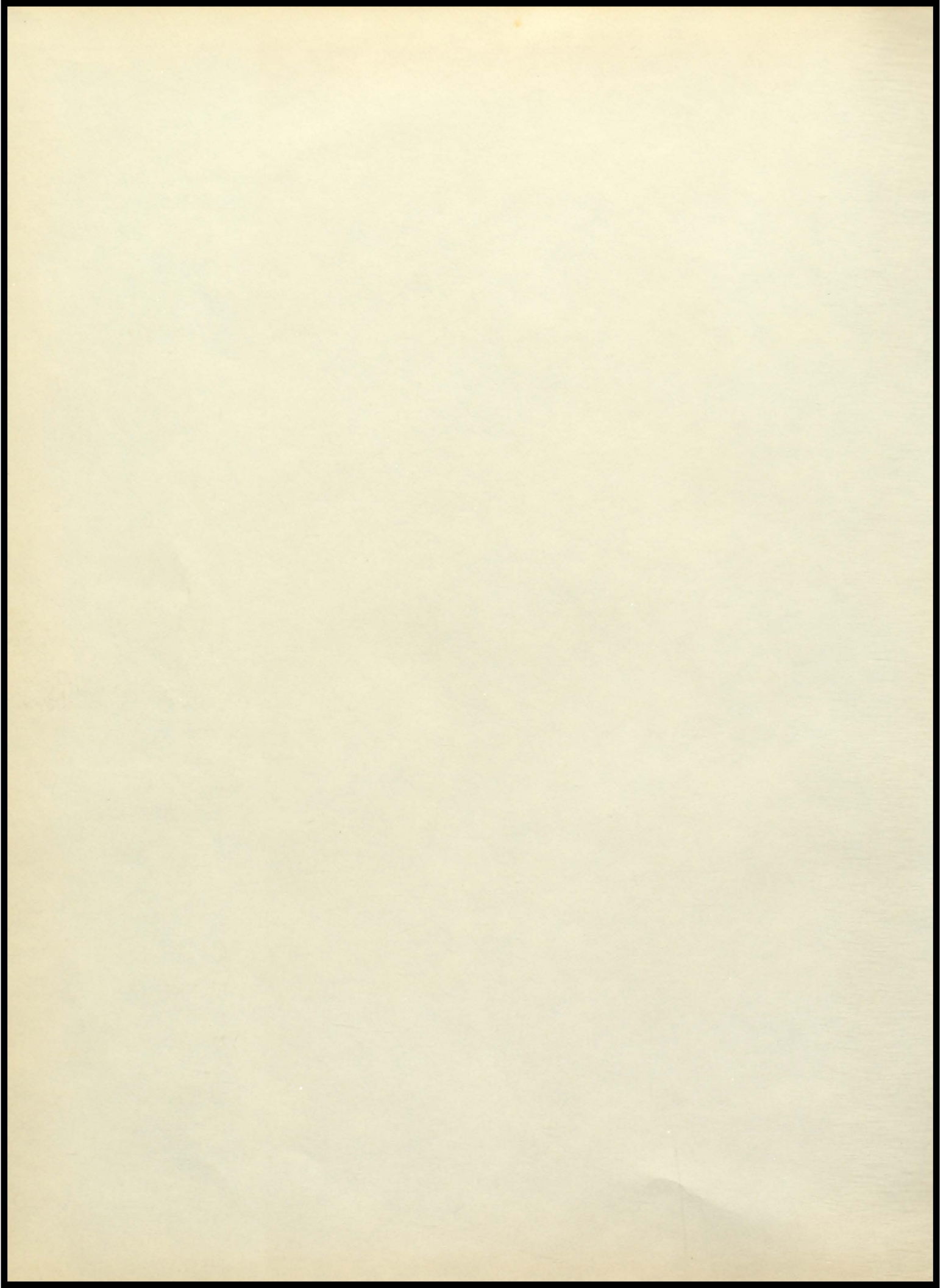

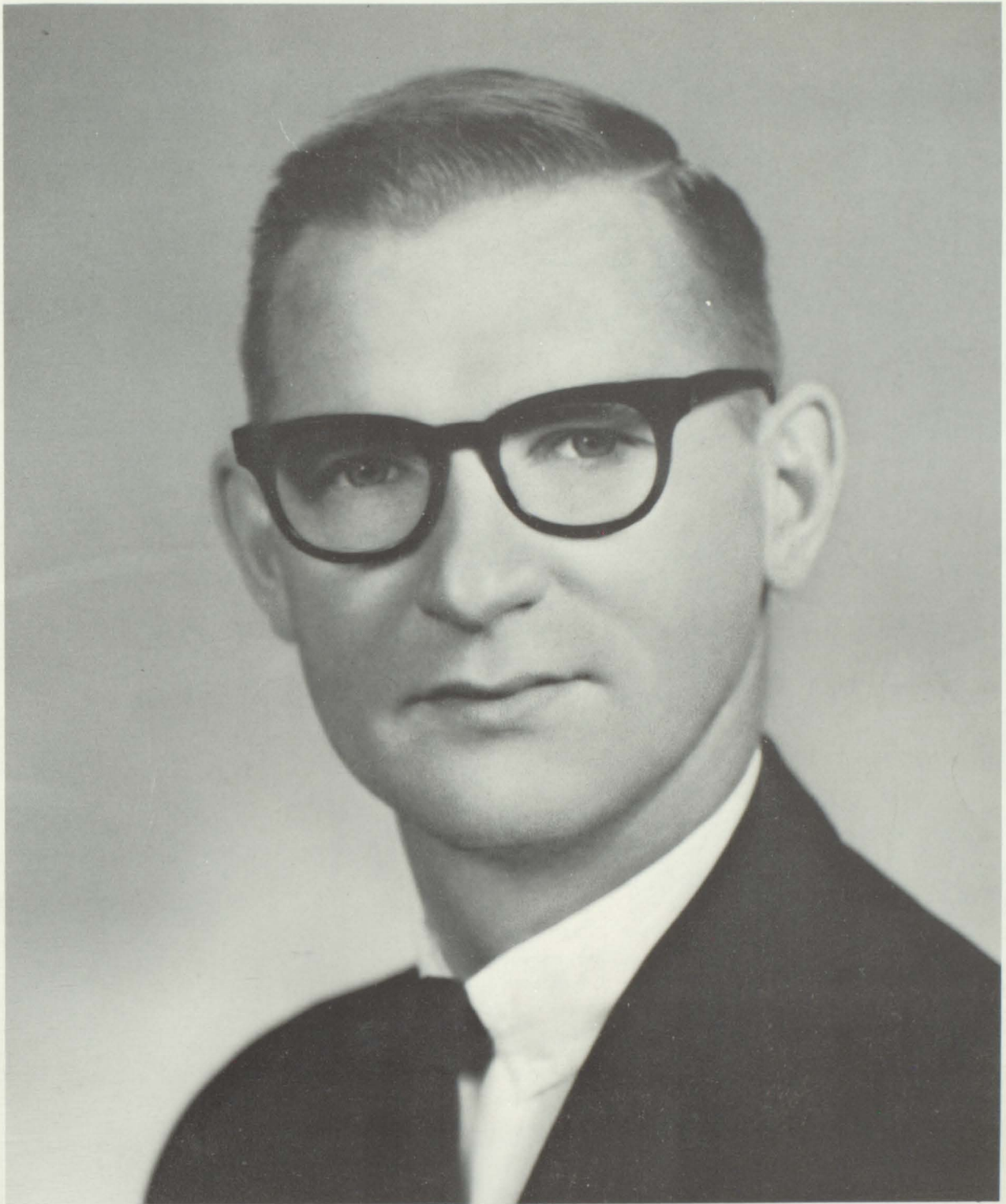




## ***In Appreciation***

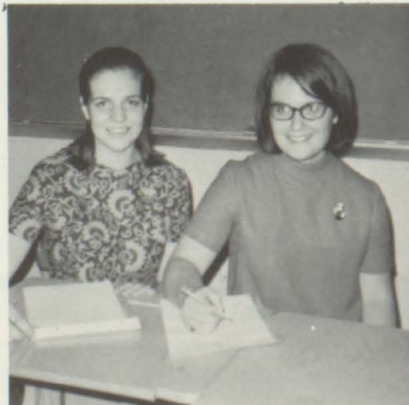

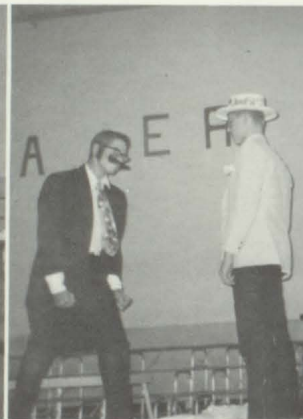
Bernetta Warden, 1967 Homecoming queen, was crowned and congratulated on September 29 by last year's queen, Pam Cash.

The speech class, along with the vocal music department, presented the Christmas Assembly on December 22.



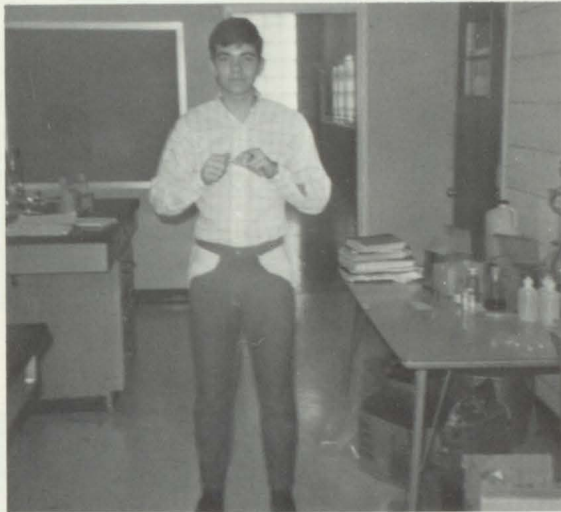
