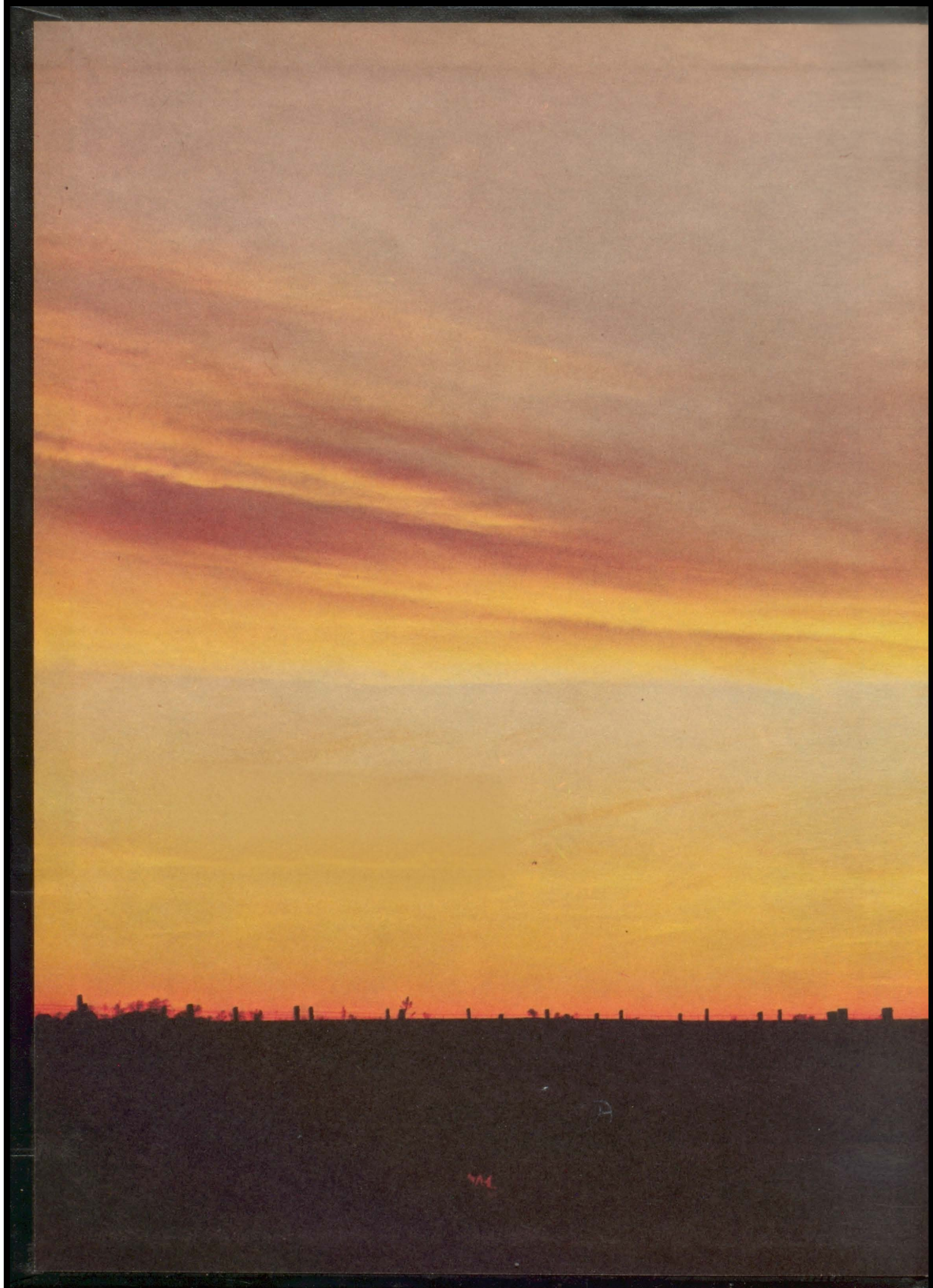
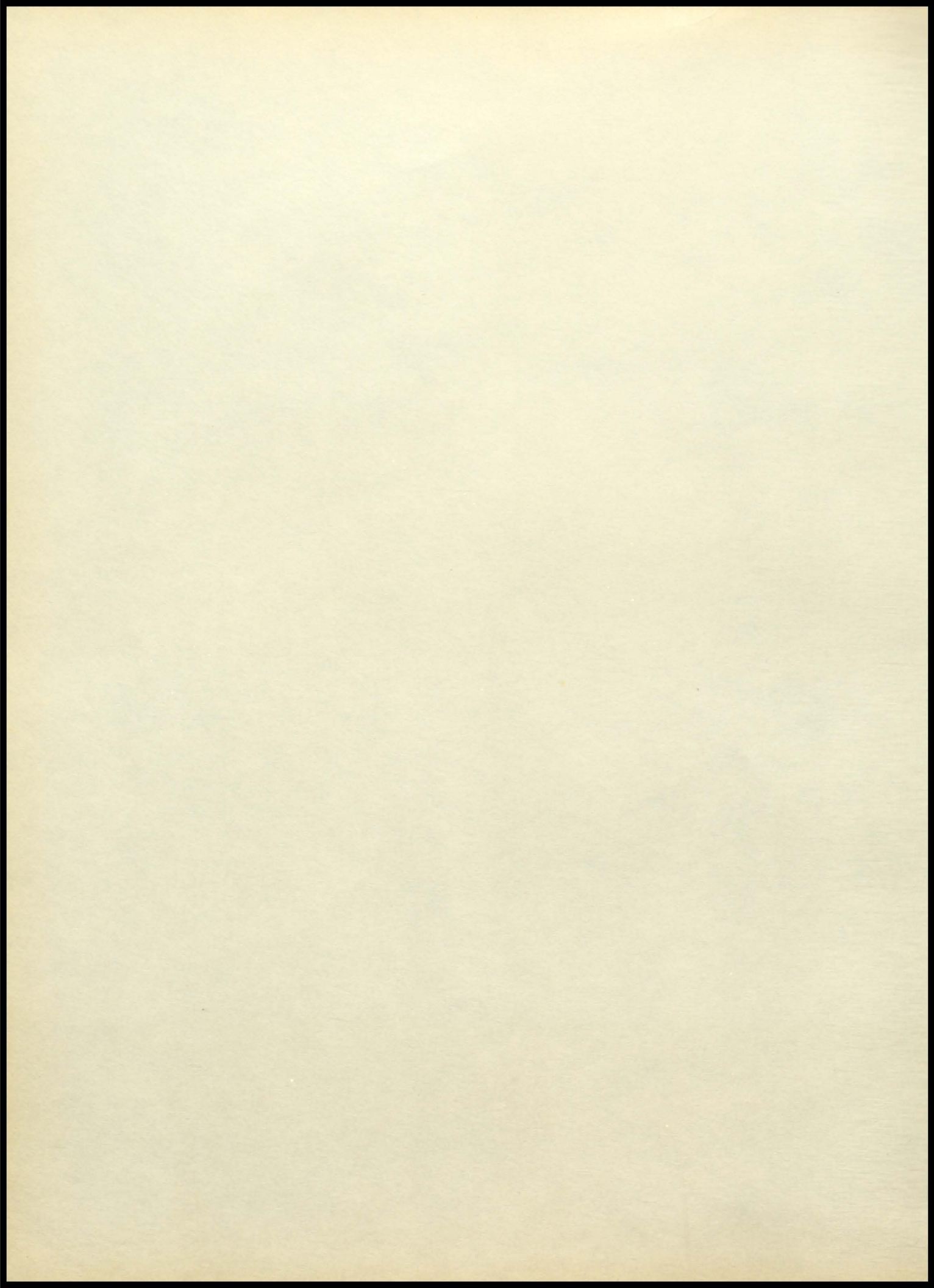

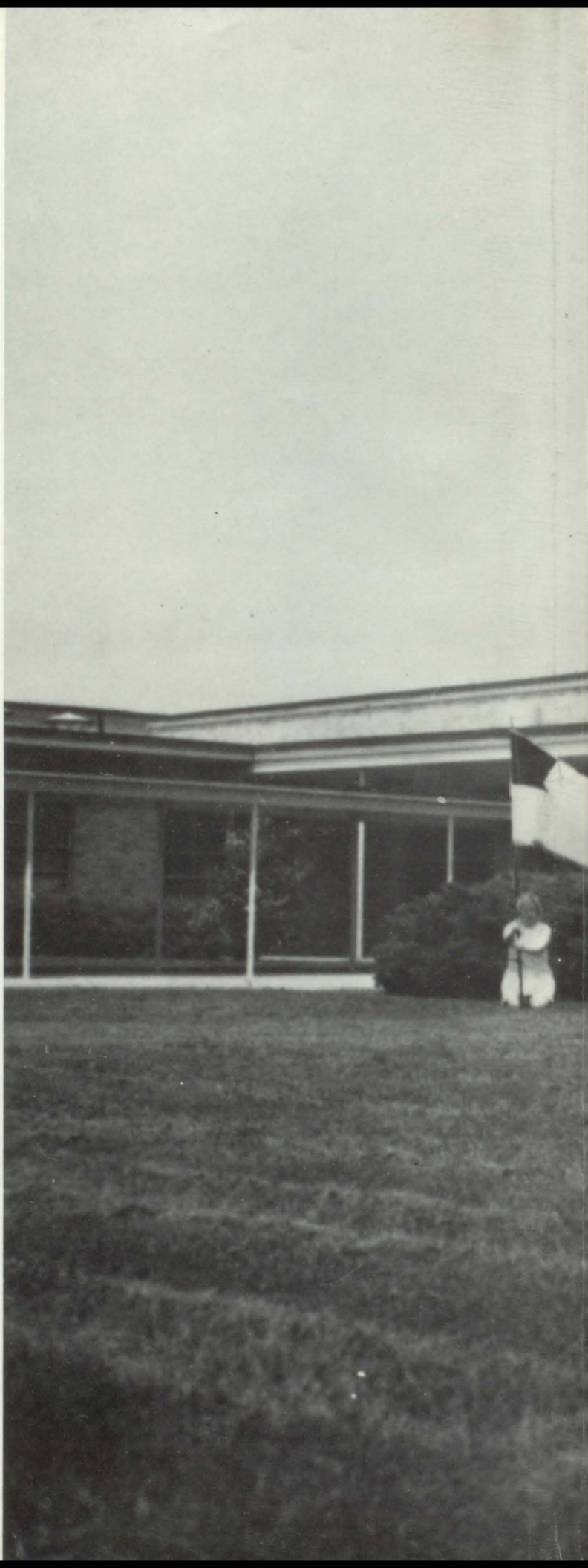
The Heliostat was first published in 1912. At that time there were only 14 seniors in Centralia High School. During the war years the Heliostat was discontinued.

As you leaf through this book, lean back and let the memories draw you back into the past. Before your eyes will appear the highlights of the year gone by.

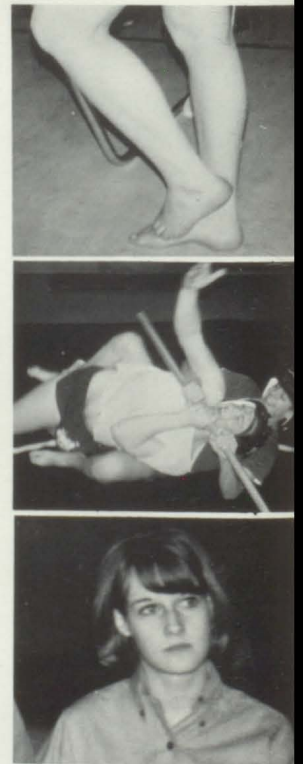
