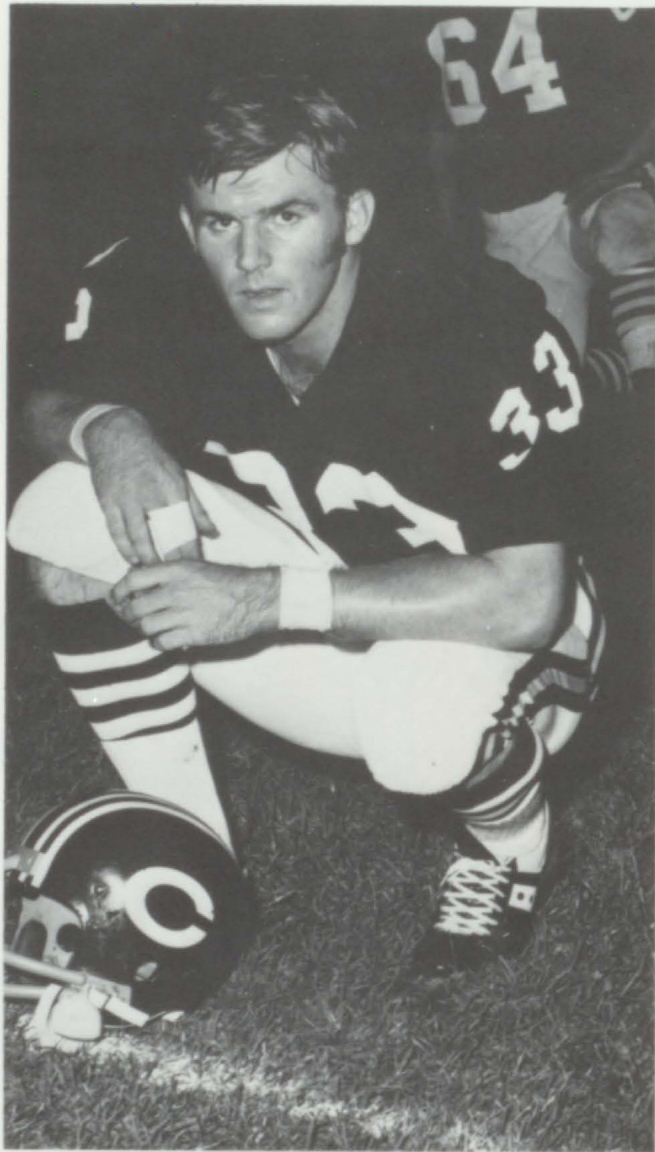

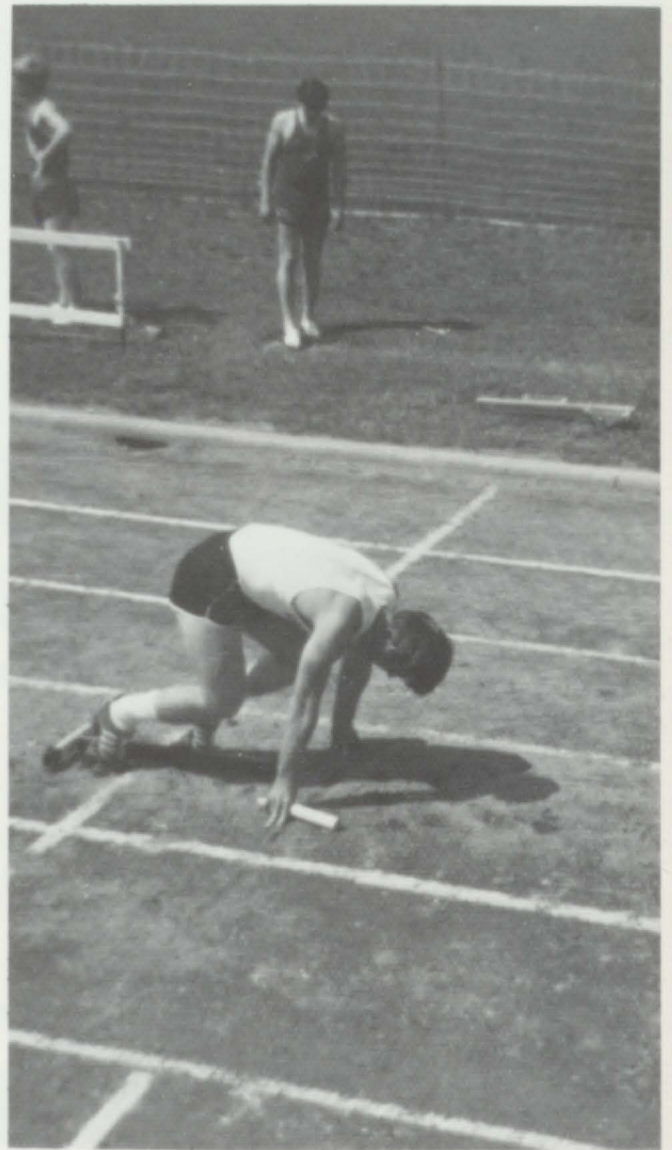
Bruce

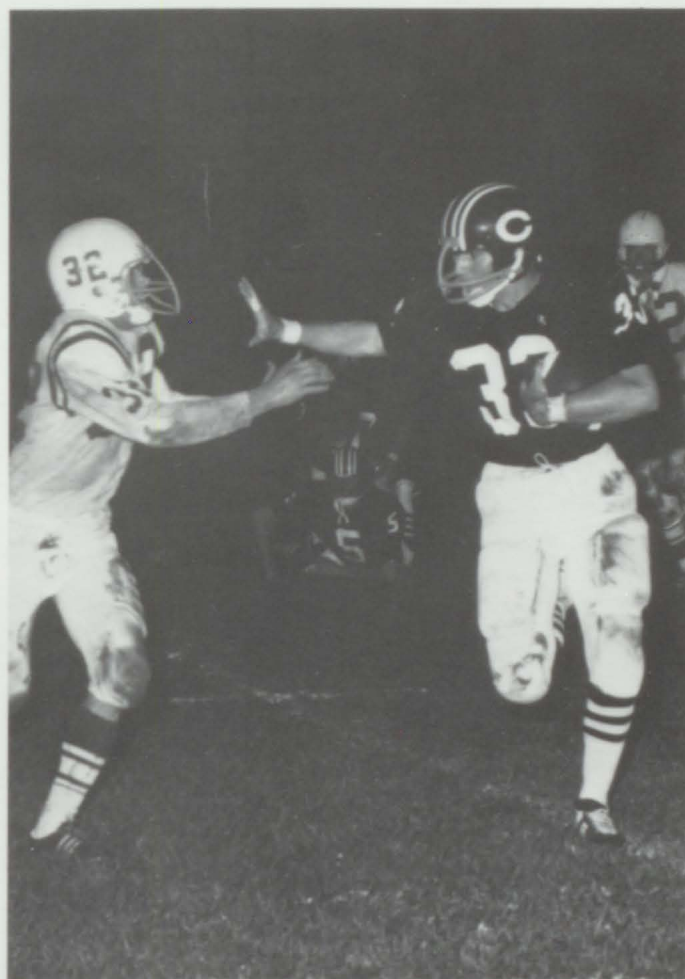
At the annual Band Carnival, Bruce entertained the spectators by singing "Tie Me Kangaroo Down, Sport." Here his character is "lying, dying."

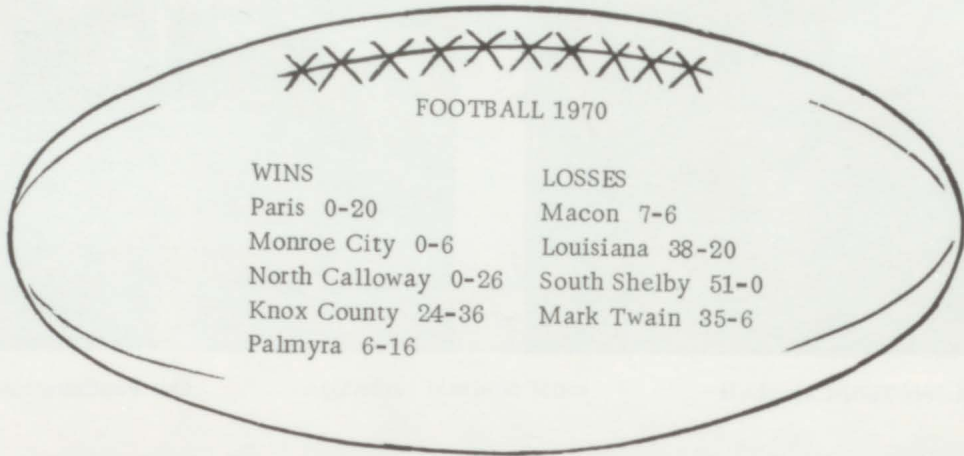
Our Panthers

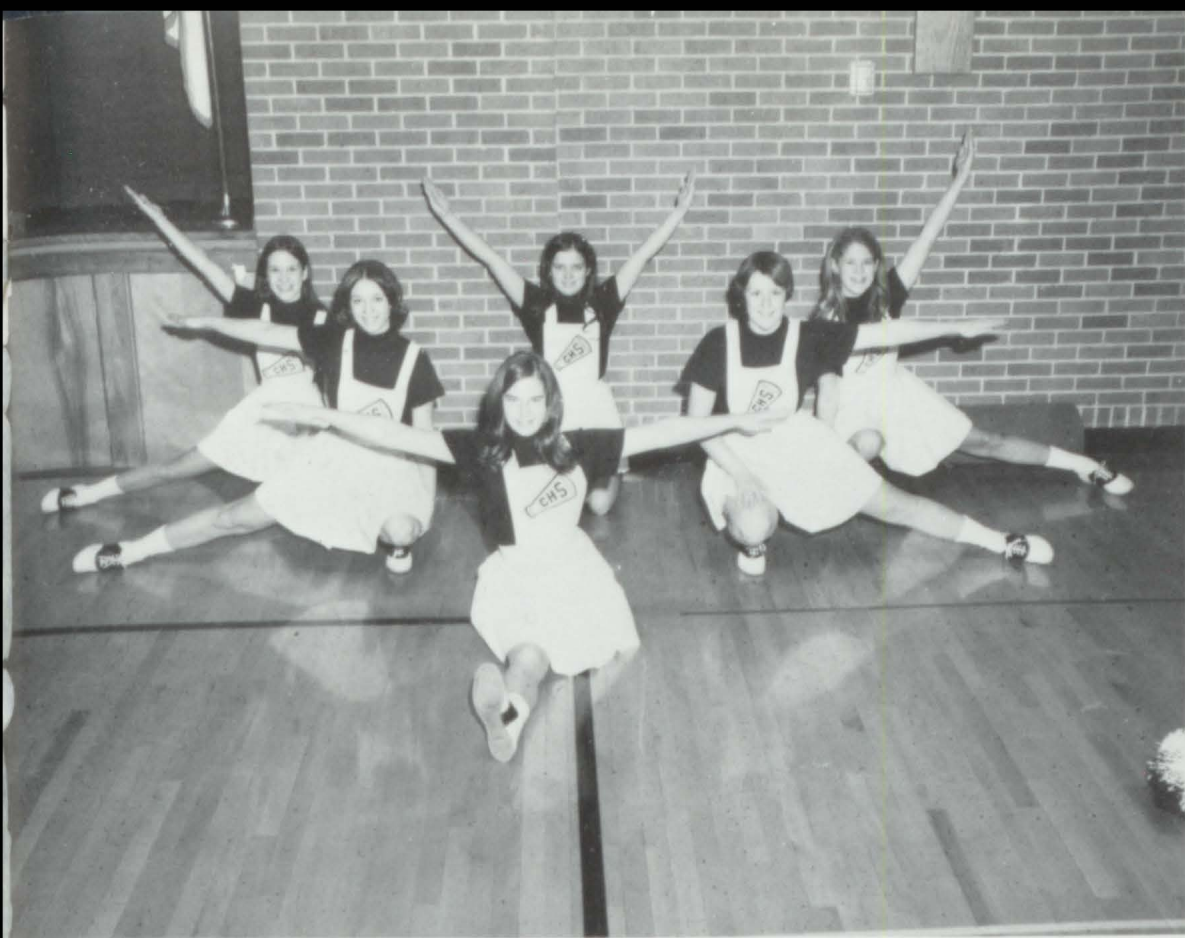
Courtwarding has become a popular event at CHS and that one week of spirit and extra effort really boosts the ego of the team.

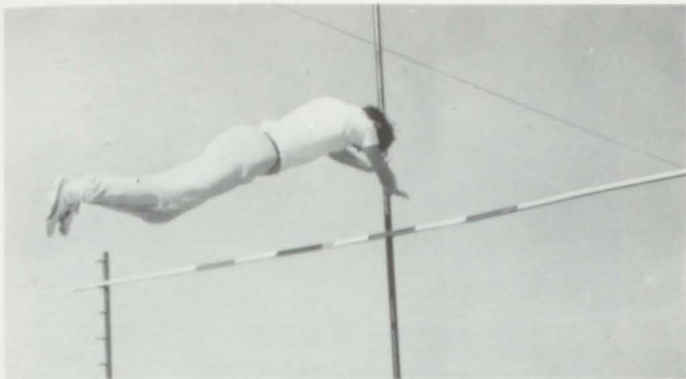
