14 area teams participated in the tournament, but as everyone knows, only one team could win.



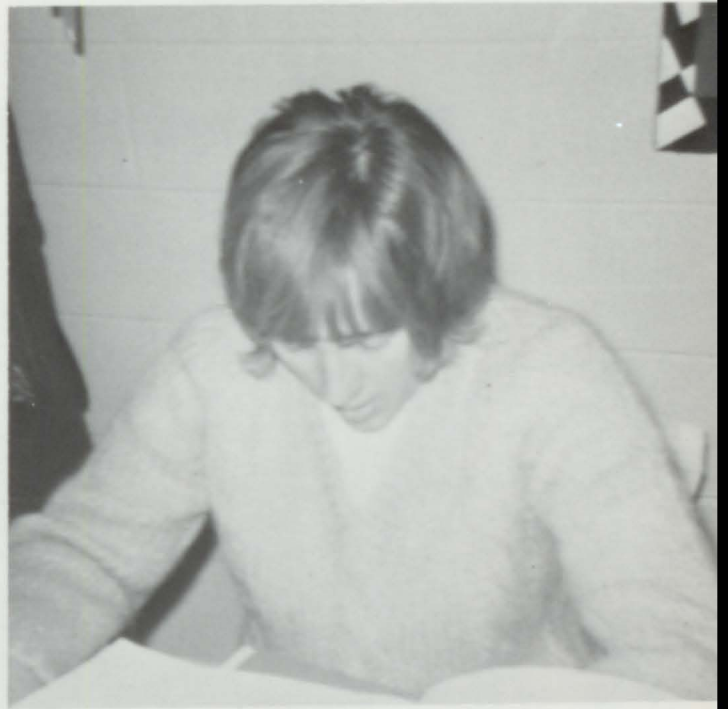

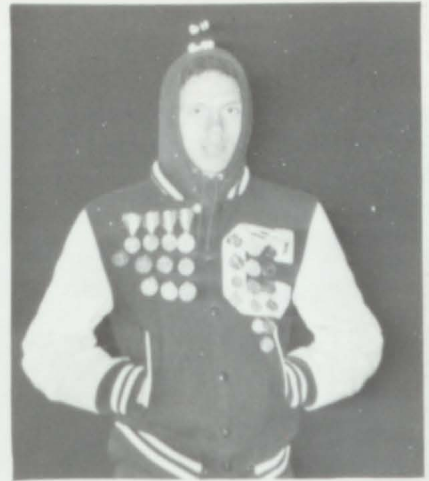
