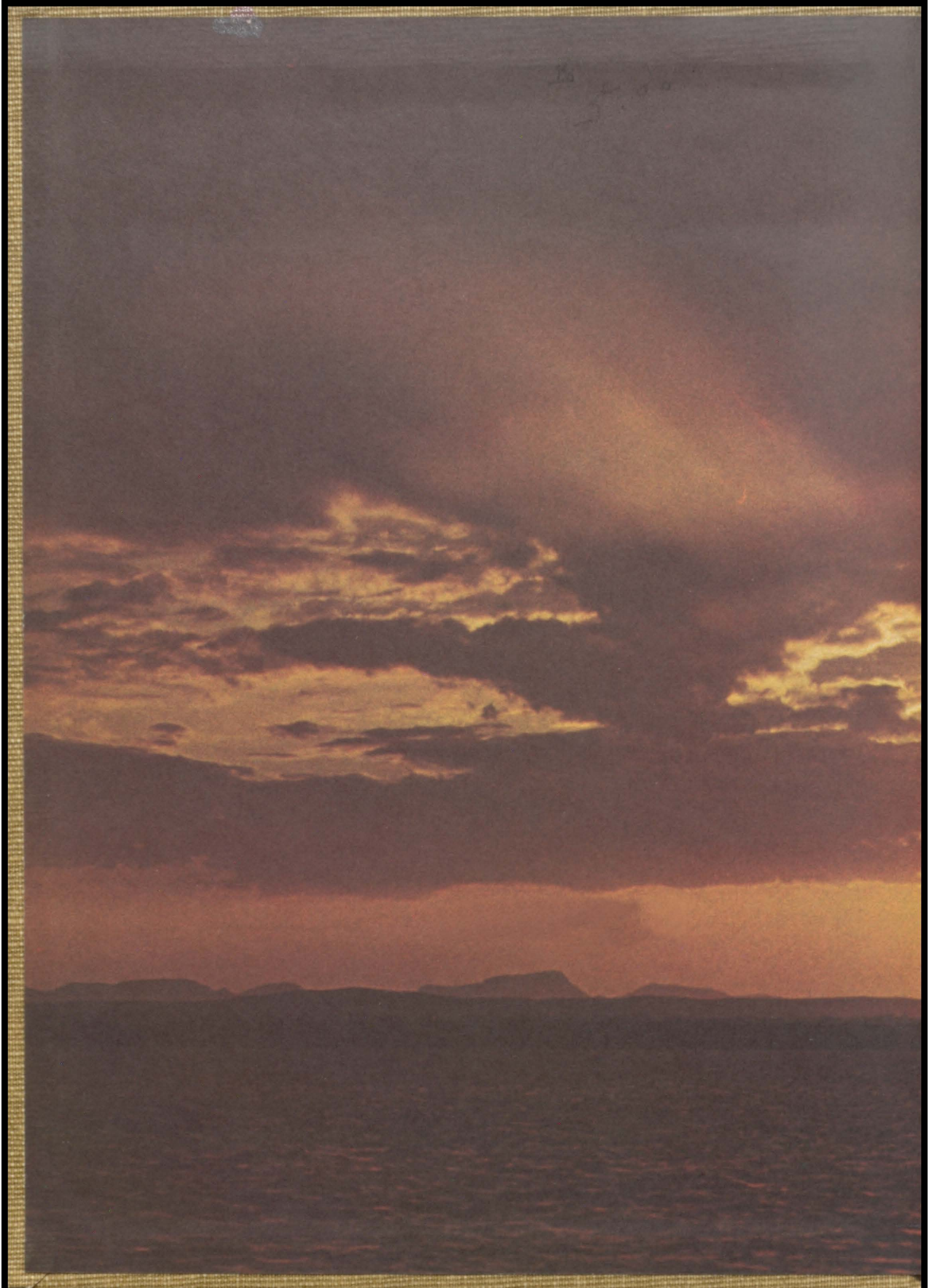
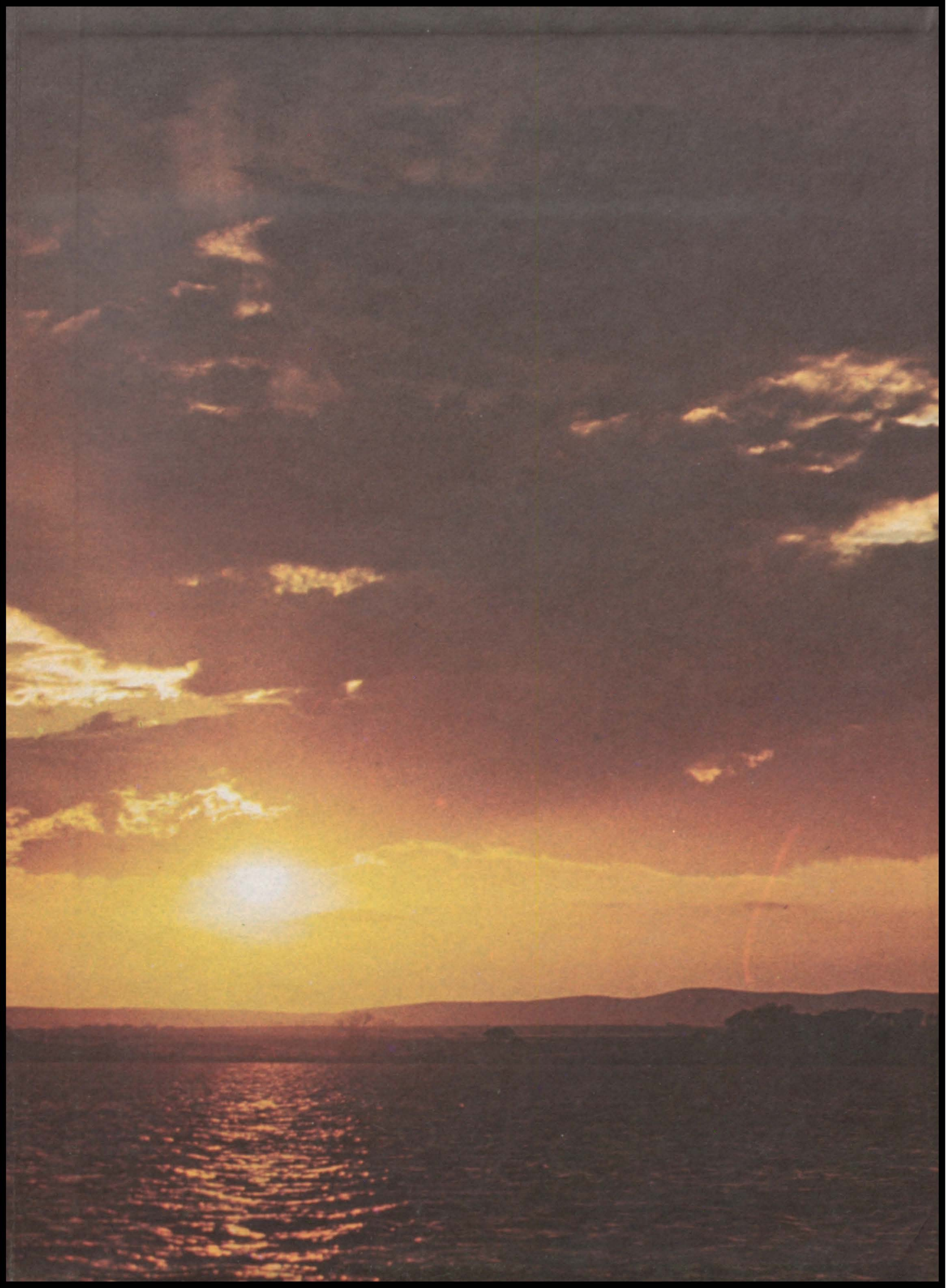
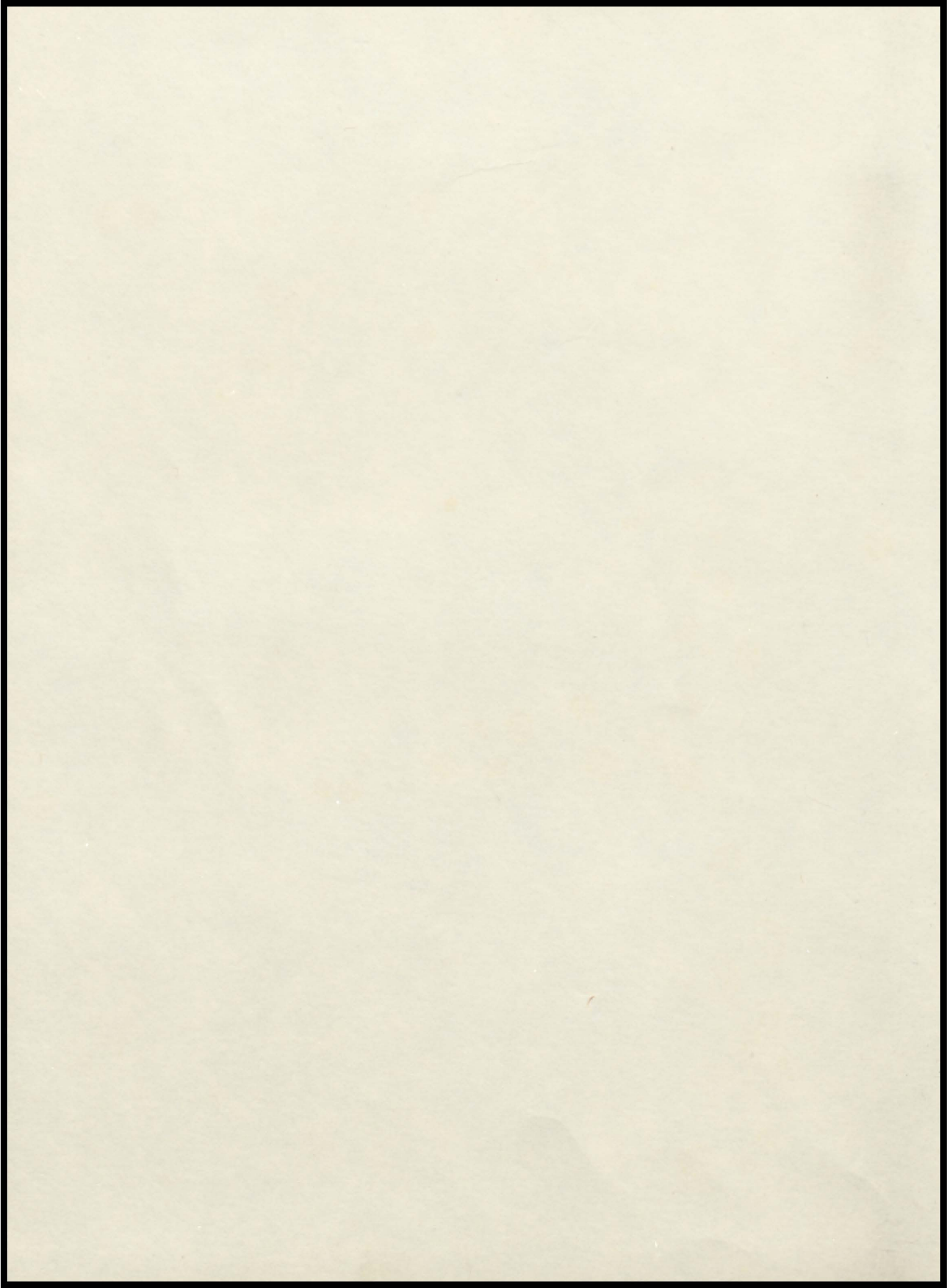




HELIOSTAT

The 15 aids in the library helped by shelving books, checking out materials to students, taking inventory and typing cards.

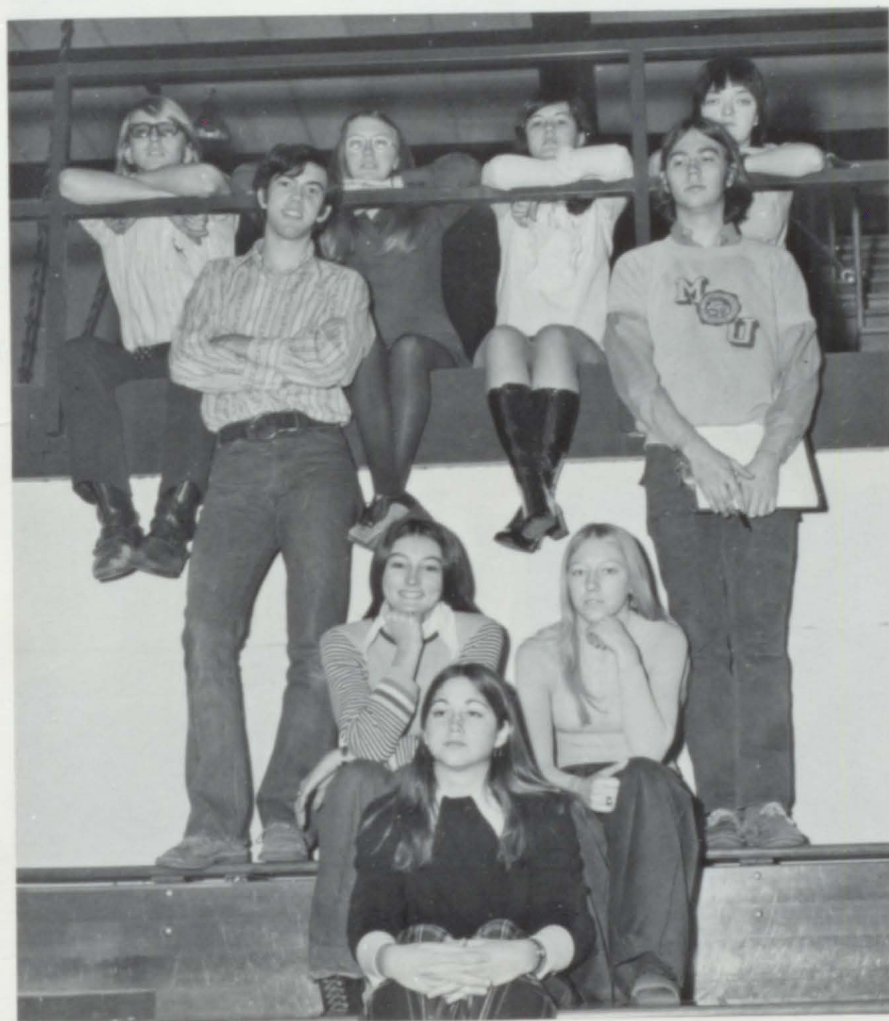

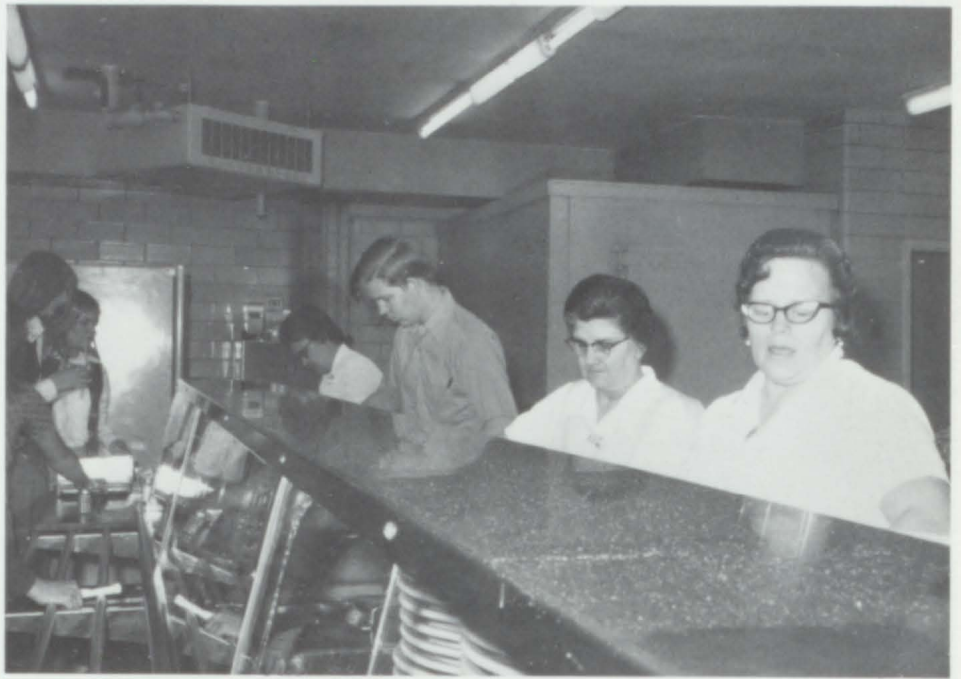


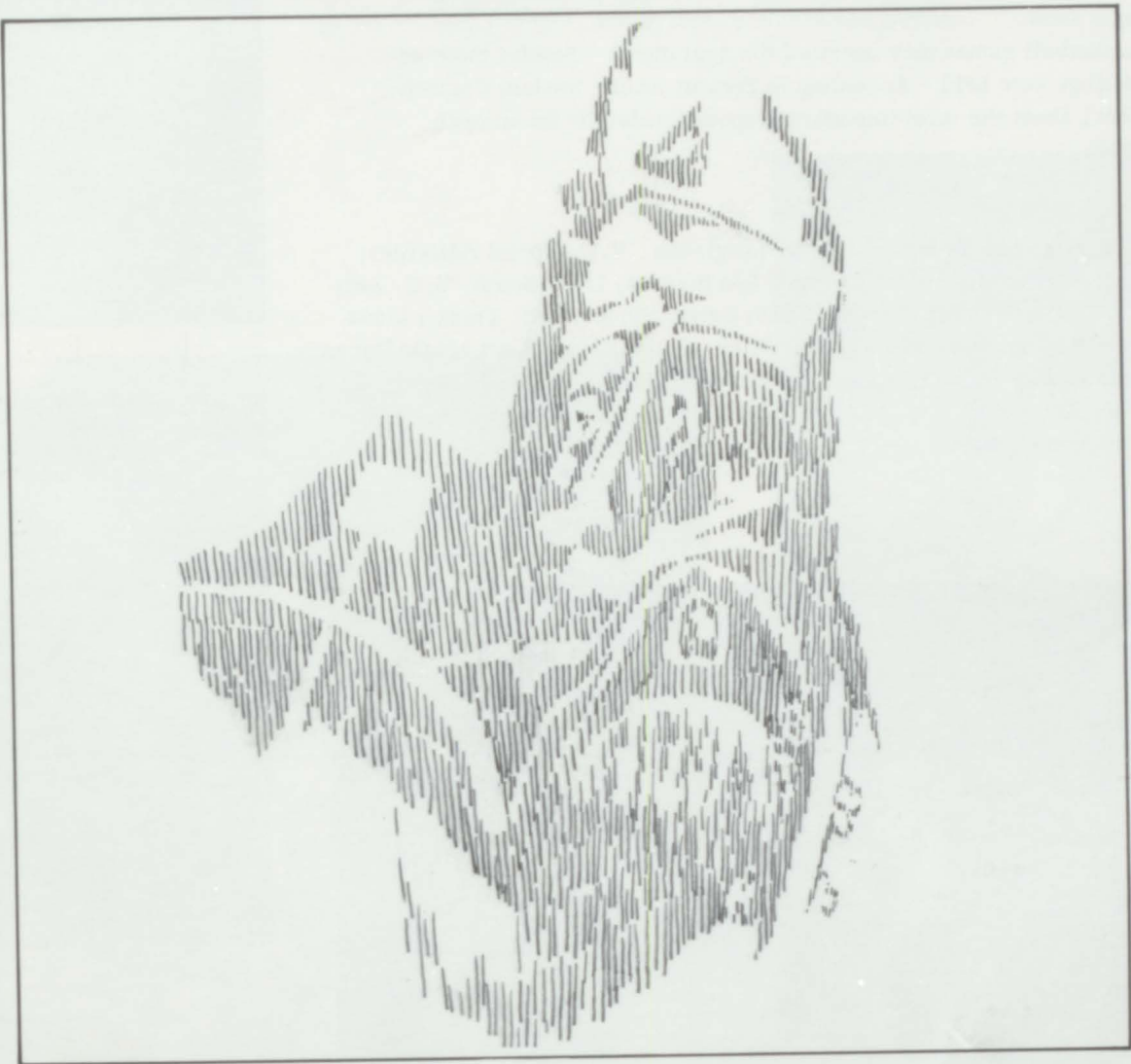
Publications Class was divided into two staffs, newspaper and annual. Both involved a lot of planning, organizing, and concentration.

To be a member of FHA a girl must have completed one year of Home Ec. or be currently enrolled.



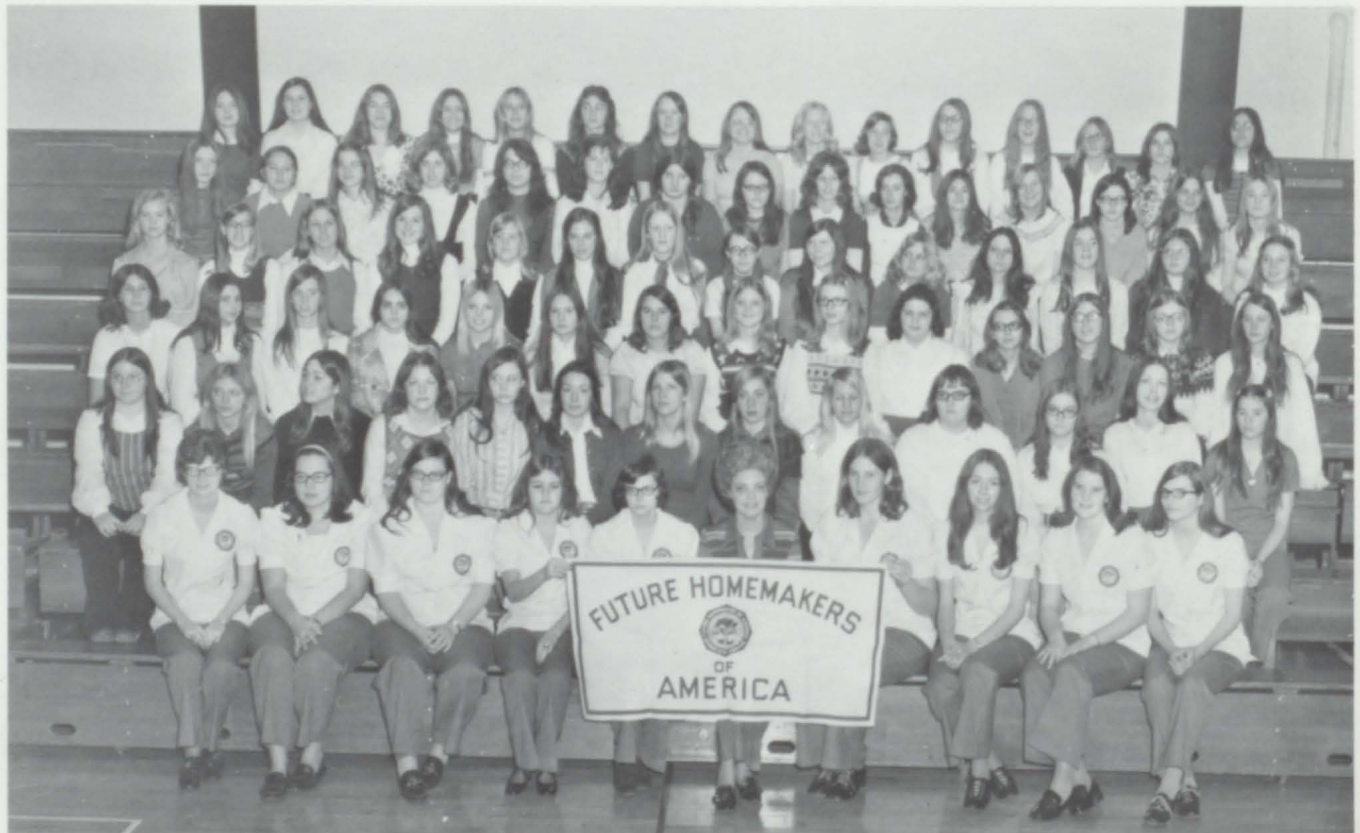

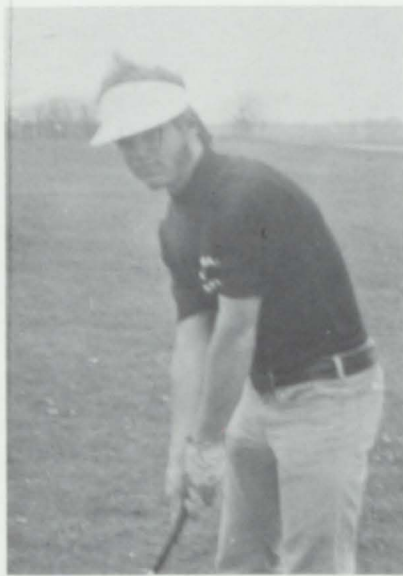

## SENIOR MOTTO USED AS PROM THEME

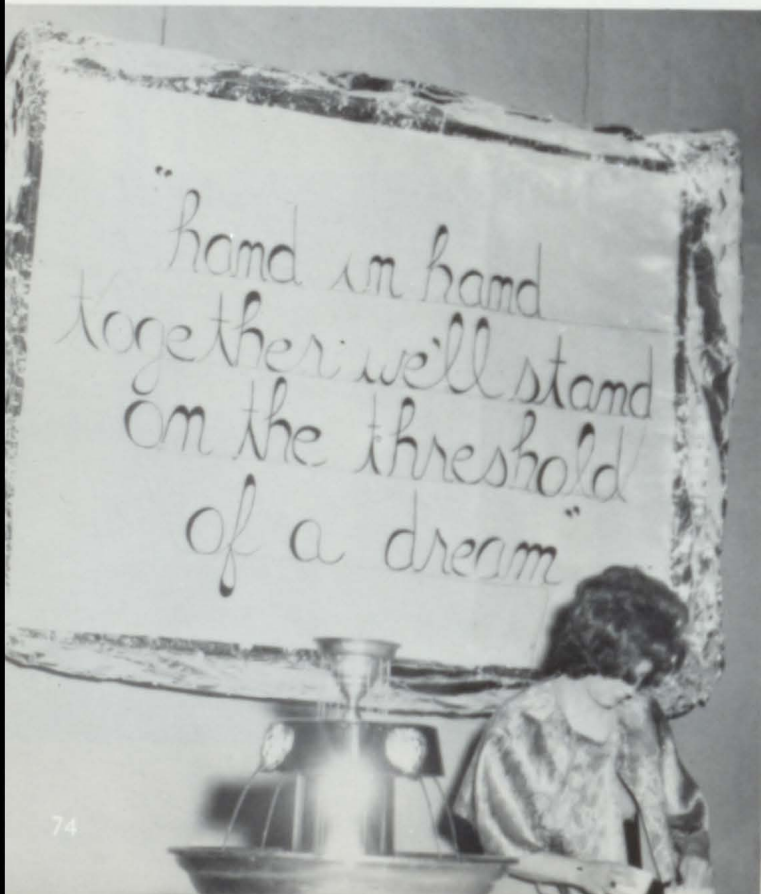

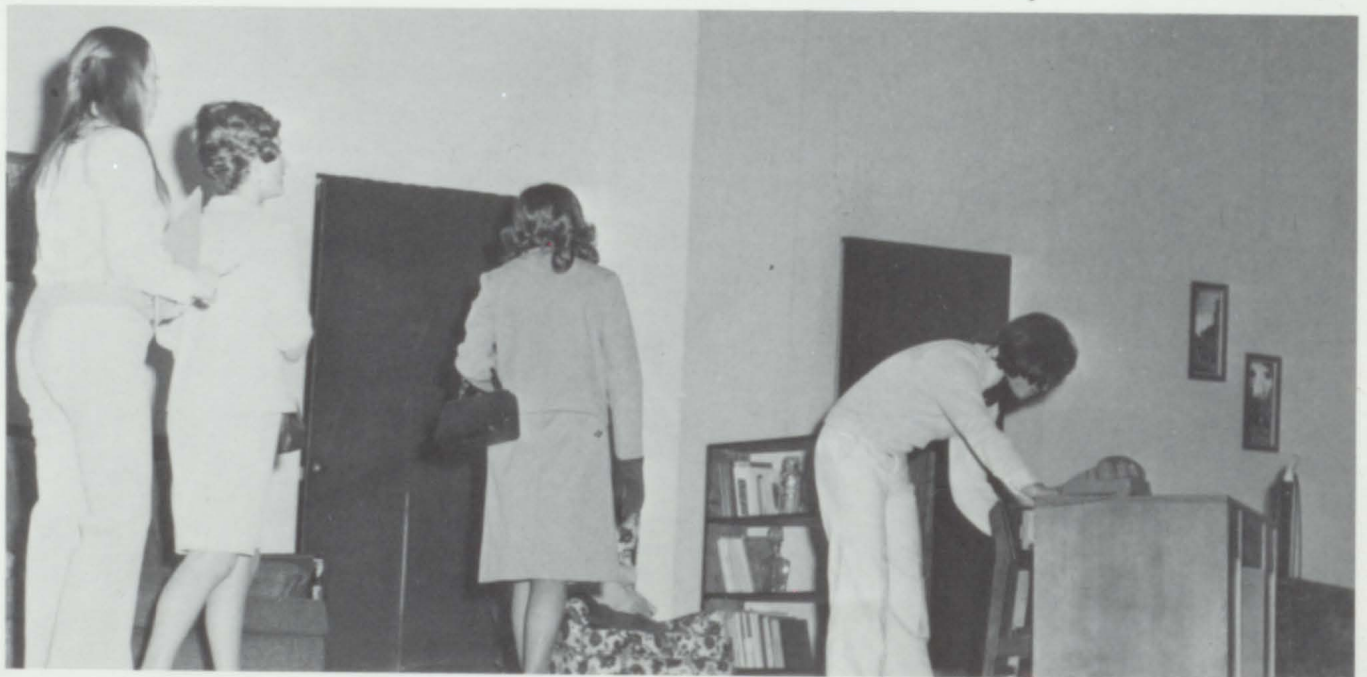

# DUNKING TEACHERS HIGHLIGHTS AFS WEEK

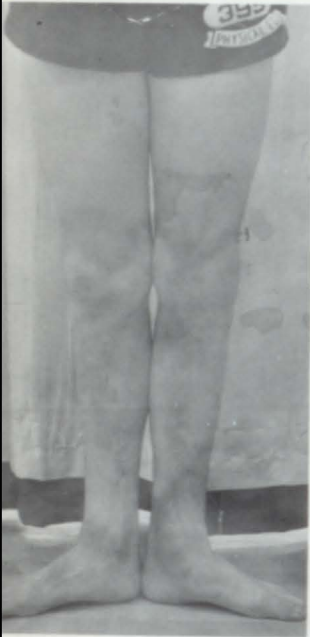
In order to raise funds for the American Field Service (AFS) program, Student Commission sponsors an annual AFS week.

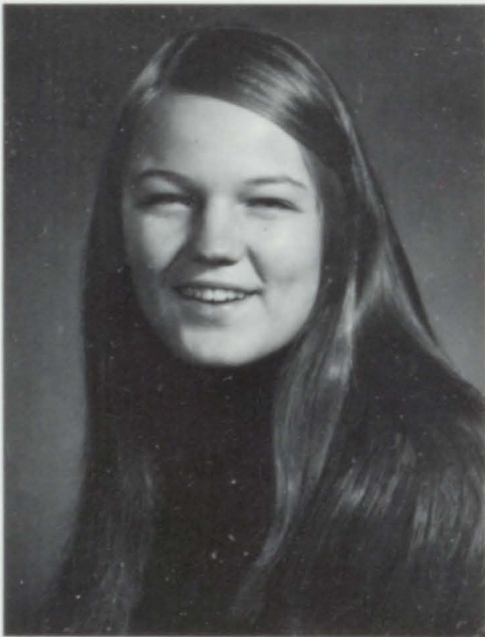


On May 16, 1973, ninety-six graduating seniors ended twelve years of hard work and looked toward the future.
