The 1978-79 Centralia Panther football team earned a large portion of the record books by posting an 11-1 record. The 11 wins were the most wins ever by a Centralia football team. 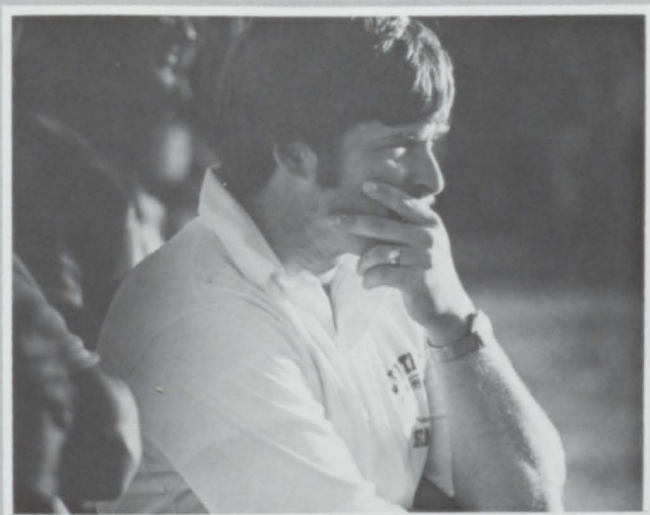

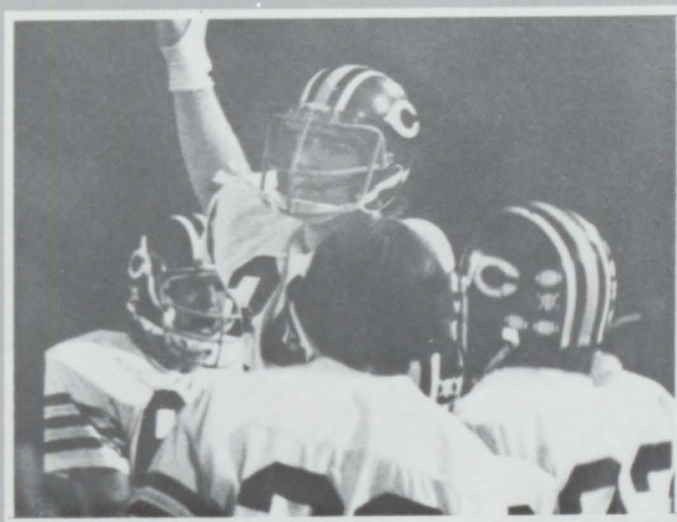


Mike Kinkead sweeps around Highland's left end.
