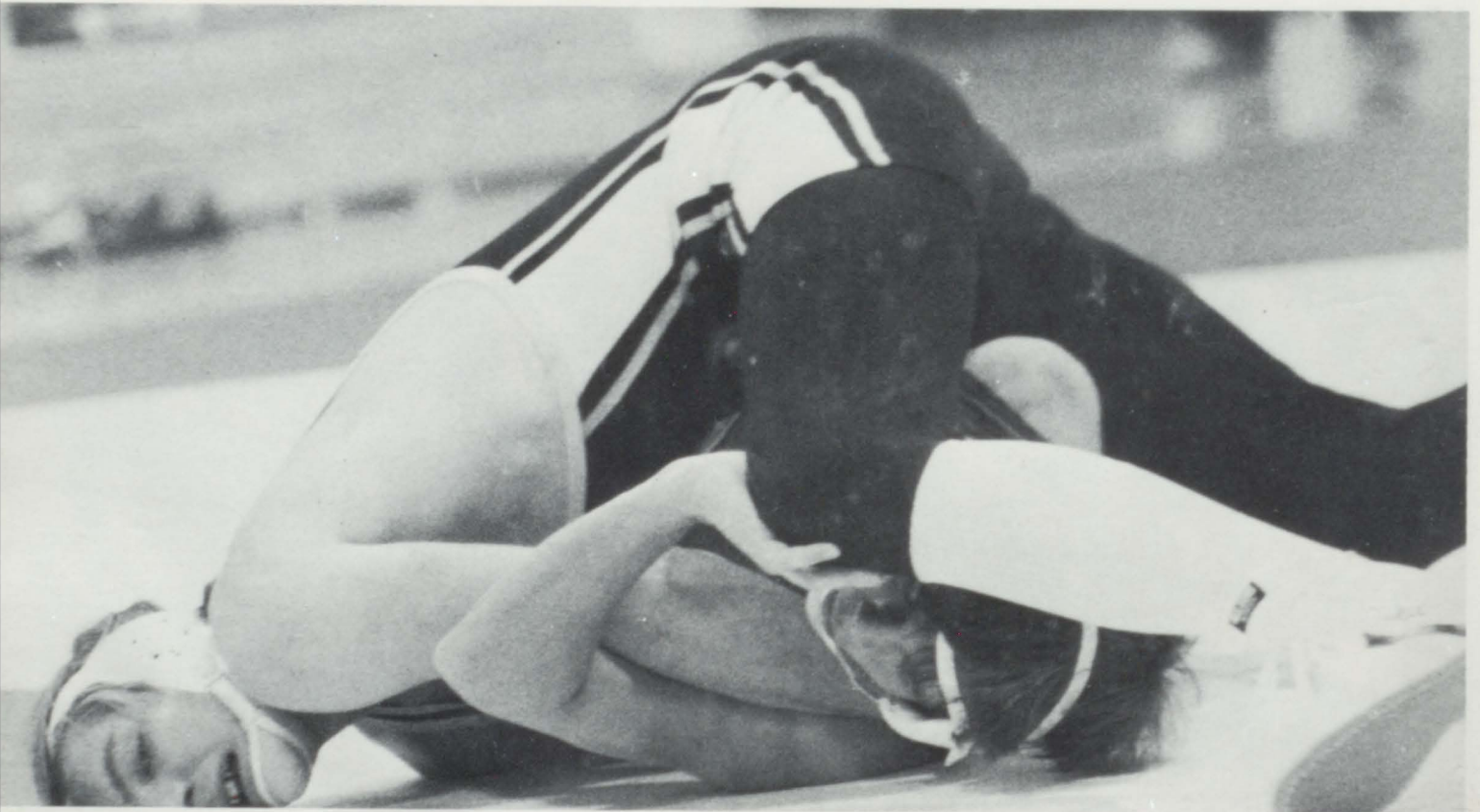
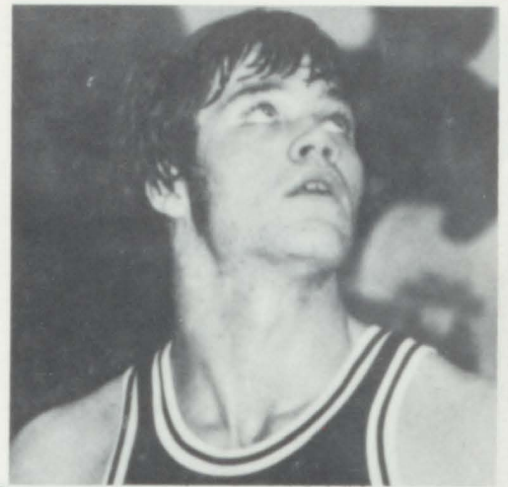
Panthers Third in State Football

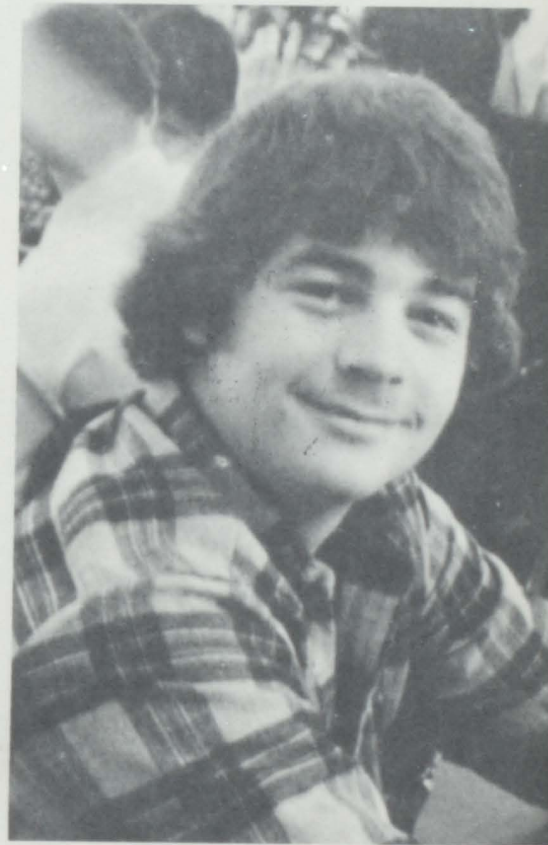


Special events such as the NHS Thanksgiving Dinner, the football banquet, and a pep assembly for opening basketball and wrestling seasons helped close the month.





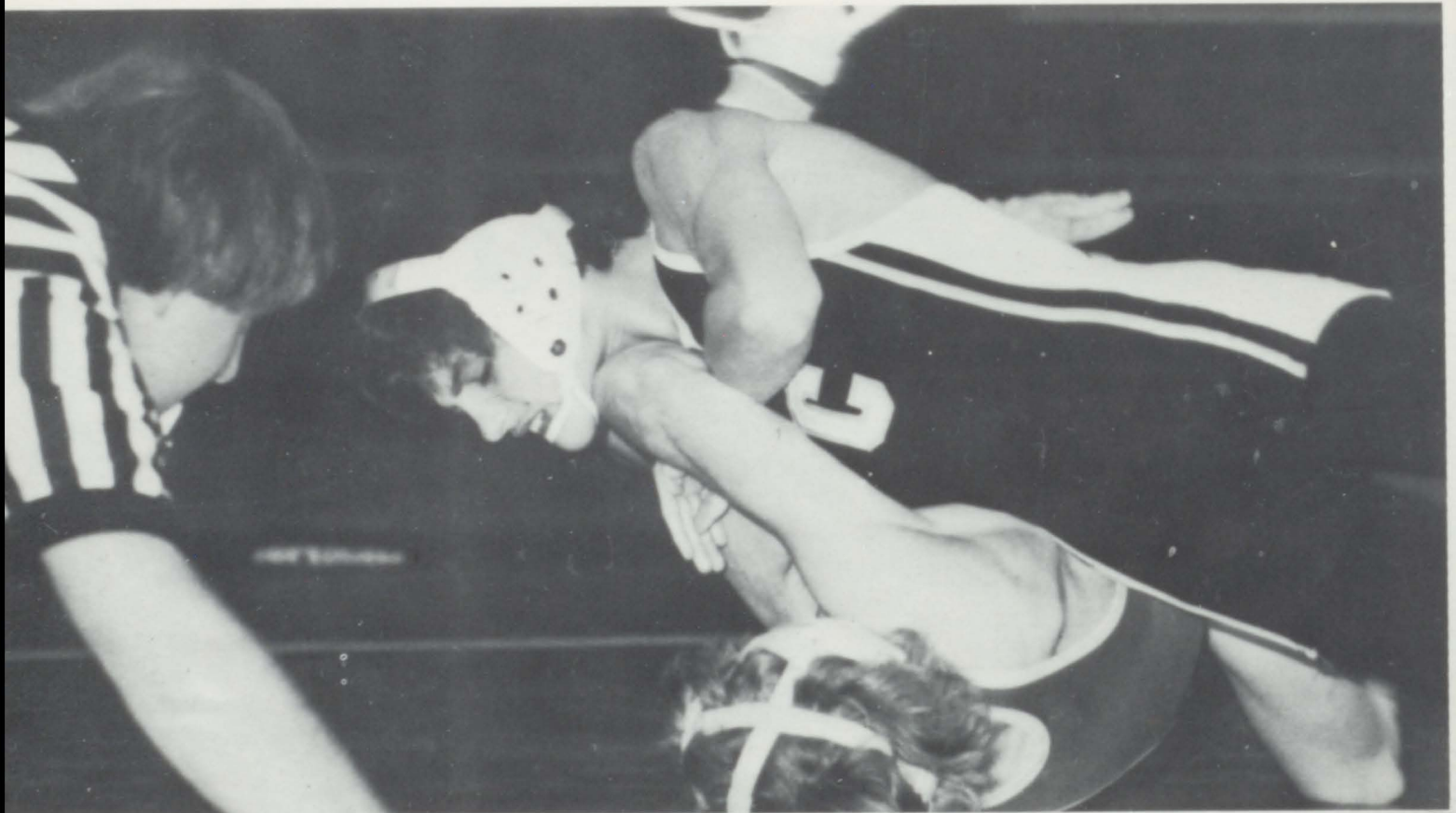

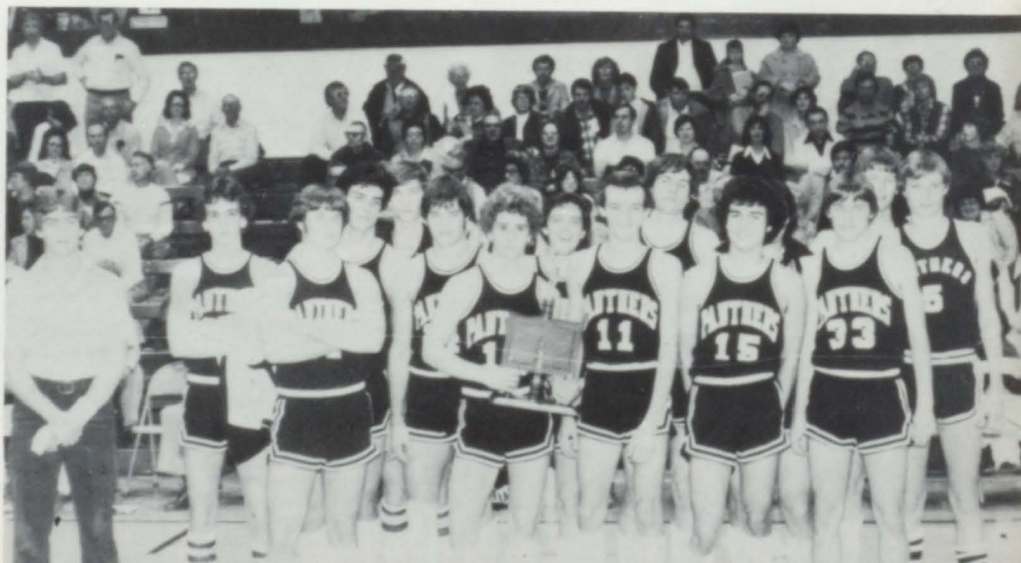

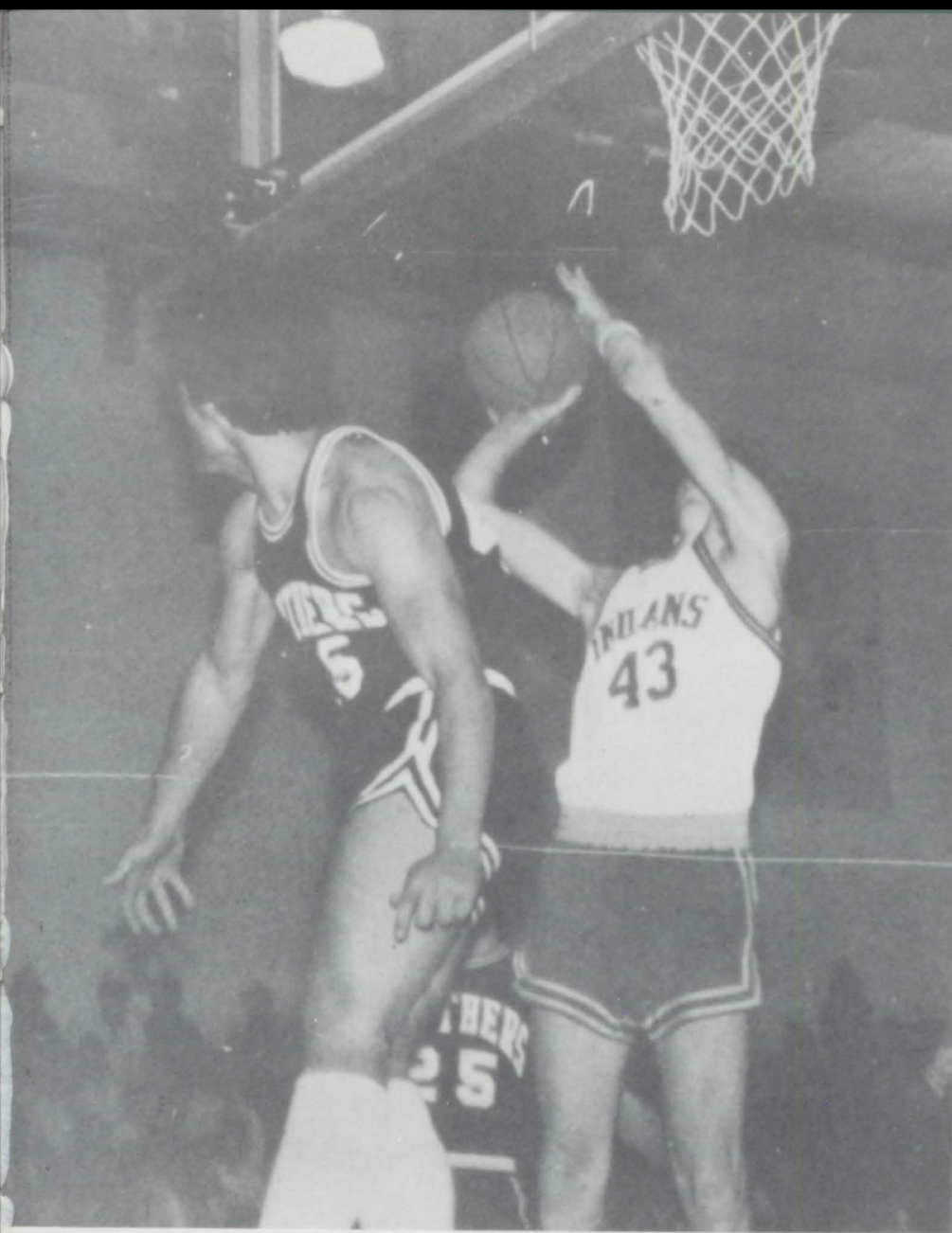

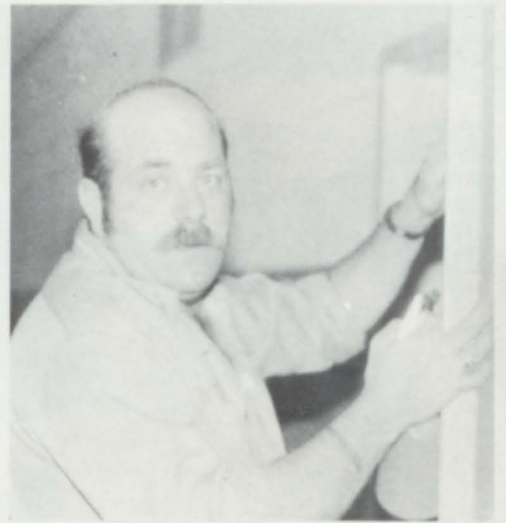

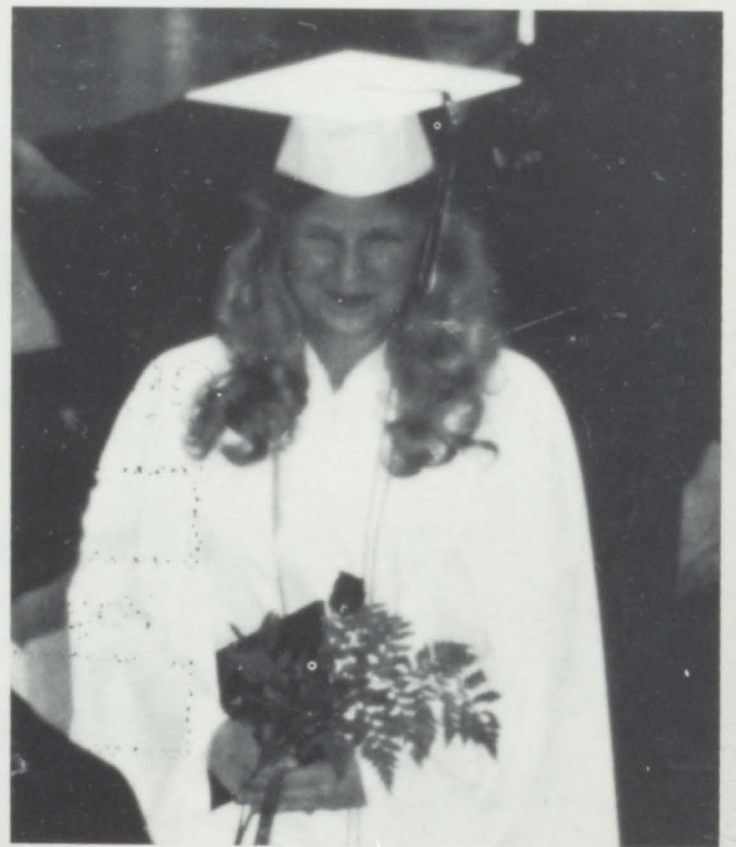

The Seniors final day at school came when they graduated on May 14 in the CHS gym. Guest speaker Ray Lansford told the class what could lie ahead of them as they leave school.

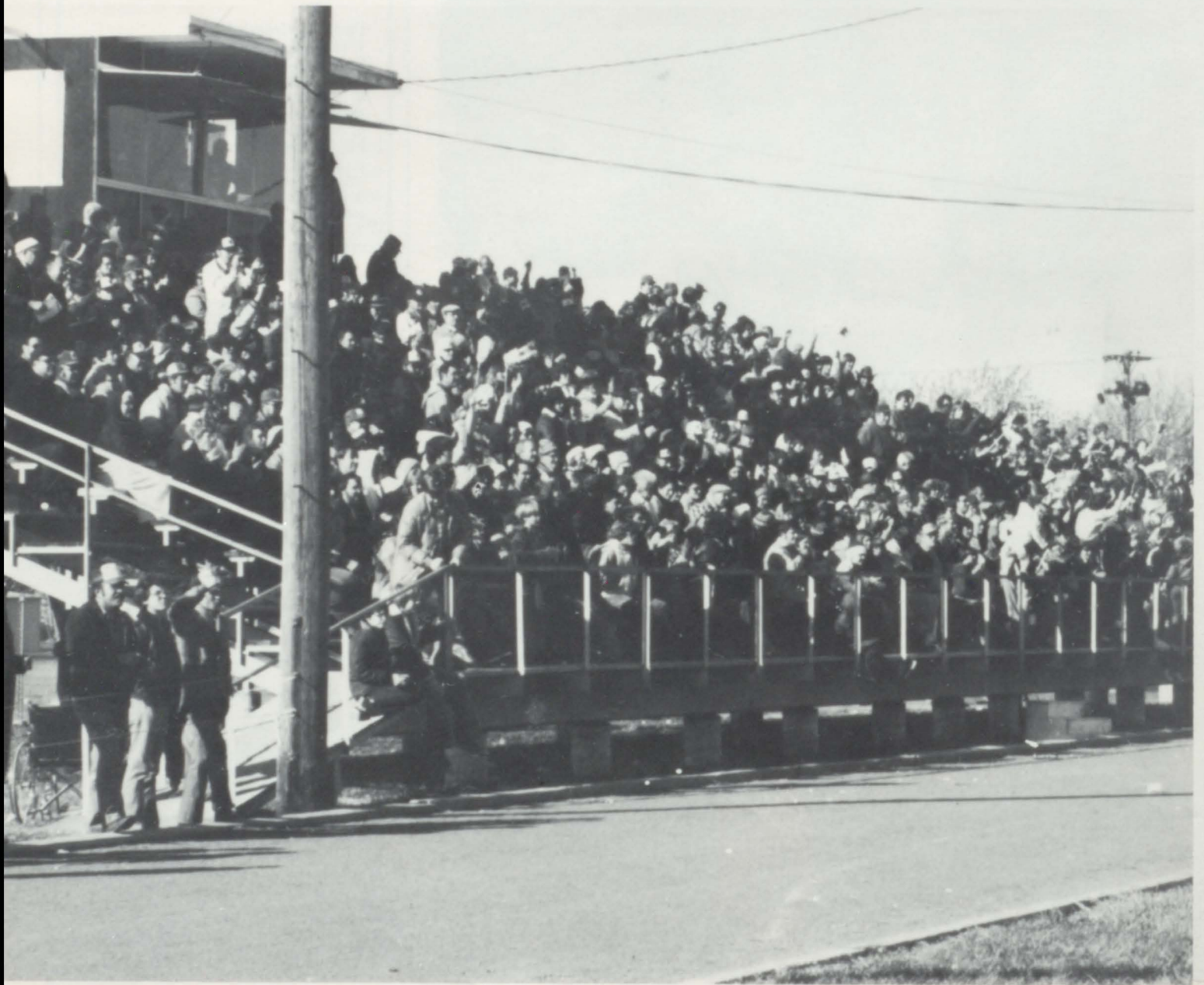
