
Cadet Teaching



Flood '93

Nine states and over 350 counties (17,000 sq. miles) were affected by the flooding of the Mississippi and Missouri Rivers and their tributaries this summer.

Levees broke, bridges and roads were closed, \$2.5 billion of crops were lost in Illinois and lowa alone, people were flooded out of their homes, and, unfortunately, over 30 people were killed.

Not only was physical damage done, but many had to change their lifestyles: volunteers moved their campers to flood areas and lived there while they gave assistance to victims; churches had to relocate their services, Sunday schools, and Bible studies; mail had to be delivered by canoe.

Aid given to victims was overwhelming. Congress passed a \$2.98 billion flood relief bill, Salvation Armies dished out hundreds of dinners, in St. Louis County volunteers built a five foot "wall of sandbags," and the Red Cross opened shelters and provided families of four with \$95 a week.

Locally CHS librarian Linda Ramsey and other librarians sent money to help rebuild flooded libraries. The CHS Stu-Co sent volunteers to the Moberly Highway Department to help fill sandbags sent to Boonville, State Farm Insurance sent volunteers to sandbag, and 63 Diner and many radio stations raised money for victims.







Roast beef, carrots, new potatoes, a small salad, fruit cup, and spiced applesauce cake were served as each evening's dinner.



For two months prior to the performances, students and director Mike Pierson prepared for the traditional dinners.


"The students worked very hard to put on an excellent performance, which really made this year's performances a huge success!" Pierson said.










Let the Construction Begin!


After everyone ate, the games began. Approximately 100 students and faculty members attended, and everyone seemed to enjoy the afternoon to relax after the hectic days of packing.
















Panthers Seal a Winning Season

The CHS Panthers began the 1993 season with nine returning starters. This year's team was comprised of a lot of young players.


"This season was funny because we had a lot of things happen that normally don't during a season," head coach Tom Kivett said.


Offensively, Kivett thought the best game was the South Shelby game. The team had 362 yards of total offense.

Kivett thought the best defensive game was against Marceline. The team held a 1000 yard rusher to negative yardage.
















The junior varsity girls ended their season with an 8-4 record. They also opened their season with a win, 31-18 over Westran.










