





Bruce


Bruce showed exceptional ability in adjusting from Australian rugby to American football, playing Varsity halfback for the Panthers.


At the annual Band Carnival, Bruce entertained the spectators by singing "Tie Me Kangaroo Down, Sport." Here his character is "lying, dying."


1970-71 Varsity Basketball Squad
