

PROMOTING LITERACY

Promoting literacy in infants and toddlers is crucial for their cognitive development. Below are ideas and suggested activities to engage infants and toddlers' language development and early literacy skills.



Reading Aloud

Even though infants may not understand the words, reading aloud to them exposes them to the rhythm and patterns of language. Choose board books with colorful pictures and simple sentences.



High Contrast Books

Infants are attracted to high-contrast patterns. Opt for books with bold black and white images, as these are easier for them to focus on.















Interactive Books

Choose books with textures, flaps, or mirrors. These tactile experiences enhance sensory development and make reading a more engaging activity.















Rhyme and Song

Singing nursery rhymes and songs introduces infants to the musicality of language. It also helps in developing their listening skills.

















Pointing and Labeling

Point to objects in books and label them. This helps infants associate words with images and builds their vocabulary.





Puppet Play

Use puppets to tell simple stories or sing songs. Infants are captivated by the movement and different voices, making it an entertaining and educational experience.





Daily Routine Narration

Describe daily activities to your infant. Whether it's bath time, mealtime, or playtime, narrate what you are doing. This helps them connect words with actions.





Soft Books

Introduce soft, fabric books that infants can touch and explore with their hands and mouths. These are safe and durable for little ones.





Use personalized books or labels with the infant's name. This helps them recognize and eventually understand the concept of names.





BABY RHYMES

Tickle: "Baby's Fingers"

These are baby's fingers (touch fingers)

These are baby's toes (touch toes)

This is baby's belly button (touch stomach)

Round and round it goes! (tickle)

Tickle: "Round and Round the Garden"

Round and round the garden like a teddy bear (swirl finger around palm)

One step, two step (walk fingers up child's arm)

Hidden under there! (tickle child's underarm)

Rhyme: "Teddy Bear, Teddy Bear"
Teddy bear, teddy bear, turn around
Teddy bear, teddy bear, touch the ground
Teddy bear, teddy bear, reach up high
Teddy bear, teddy bear, touch the sky
Teddy bear, teddy bear, touch your knees
Teddy bear, teddy bear, sit down please



Bounce: "Toast in the Toaster"

I'm toast in the toaster (bounce)

And I'm getting very hot!

Tick, tock, (move side to side)

Tick, tock

Up I pop! (lift baby up)
